## PRHS Principal Placed on Administrative Leave Following On-Campus Law Enforcement Action

Paso Robles, CA—At approximately 10:45 AM on Monday, November 10, Paso Robles High School Principal, Megan Fletcher, was taken into custody by the Paso Robles Police Department. She was on the school campus at the time of arrest. At no point was there any danger to students or staff. The campus remained safe, and school operations continued without interruption.

Following the incident, Fletcher was placed on administrative leave. Because this is a confidential personnel matter, we are not able to share further details; please refer to the Paso Robles Police Department summary for additional information.

Assistant Principal and Athletic Director, Mr. Mike Susank, will serve as the Acting Interim Principal for Paso Robles High School. Mike Susank brings a wealth of experience in educational leadership and student development. Prior to joining Paso Robles Joint Unified School District, he served as Principal at Mission College Preparatory in San Luis Obispo. We are confident that Mr. Susank will ensure a smooth continuation of school operations and leadership during this transition.

Separately, in June 2025, Fletcher was involved in a traffic incident while operating a District vehicle while traveling to a work related, out of town conference. The incident was reported to CHP. Fletcher was not charged with a hit-and-run as is being rumored.

Paso Robles Joint Unified School District continues to work collaboratively with the Paso Robles Police Department to ensure the safety of our students and staff.
